Shipmates, with this January 2020 newsletter, you may notice the insert explaining that the 2020 dues are now due. Alternatives to Shipboard Tour and "Stay or Play" Options



USS Saratoga Association on Social Media

As many of you already know, we have a very active and lively Facebook group where Saratogians can share stories, post photos and communicate over the World Wide Web. We have several "Admins" who maintain a "tight ship" and make sure members follow the site rules to keep it family friendly. If you've never seen it, you might be surprised at how many members are in the group. As of this writing, 3,891 people are members of the group. This has proven to be one of our best outreach efforts for new members.



Christians around the world have entered into the season of Advent, a time reserved by Christians to celebrate the birth of Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah of Israel and believe Him to be the savior of humanity. This did not come about as a result of idle musings or the wishful contemplation of naïve thinkers, or the conclusions by a group of individuals who were playing a guessing game.

Let me explain. It is widely known that many people are good at guessing things. For example, some are good with crossword puzzles in guessing words, or while watching the television program Wheel of Fortune, they accurately guess a word or phrase. When you were somewhat younger, say in your teens or early 20s and you were thinking about your future, were you able at that time to guess in specific details the most important future events that have since transpired in your life exactly as you predicted them to occur, say 20 or 30, or 40 years later? I would say most likely, no. I know that I did not accurately predict my current health or marital status. I never predicted the name of my wife or where I would meet her or where I would make my home with her. Certainly, my DNA had something to do with the health part, but the marital part was brought about through cabinet level negotiation. I never accurately predicted my future work status or where I would be working or the date of my retirement. Now, rewind the clock back to the times of the prophets of Israel, a time period from 740 B.C. and 530 B.C. There was a time when the prophets began to speak about a future Messiah who would arrive upon the world scene and change everything in Israel. In fact, the prophets predicted that the future Messiah would initiate changes of such magnitude that he would impact and influence everything on the stage of human history from the time of his advent until the end of days. Eventually, the prophets did begin to write in specific details the Messiah's future arrival and significance to people and specific details pertaining to his life circumstances including the end of his physical existence.

Around 740 B.C. the prophet Isaiah spoke of a future final heir of King David who would enlighten the Gentiles (non-Jews). We could say that the nation of Israel was created for this purpose. As time progressed the prophets spoke in specific details about the future Messiah. In the book of Isaiah, the future Messiah is noted as one born of a virgin (Isa. 7:14). The 53rd chapter of Isaiah offers graphic detail of the death of the Messiah and it is particularly notable that among the ranks of humanity, only Jesus of Nazareth has the fingerprint of the individual spoken about in Isaiah's descriptive account. Additional details of a future Messiah are revealed in the visions of Daniel in the 6th century B.C. (Dan. 7-12). Daniel's predictions concerning specific events of the remote future that would take place in the life of the Messiah are so accurate that those events can be historically connected to the events themselves in real time more than half a millennium later. Micah, who prophesied in Israel in the 8th century BC, specifies the place where the Messiah would be born - Bethlehem (Micah 5:2-5). Zechariah who prophesied in the 5th century B.C. prophesied the Messiah's entrance into Jerusalem as one riding on a foal of a donkey (Zech. 9:9) which Jesus did on Palm Sunday. Malachi who prophesied in the mid-5th century B.C. stated in chapter 3:1 that the Messiah's entrance would be preceded by a messenger to prepare His way. This messenger is known as the cousin of Jesus, John the Baptist (Mathew 11:10; Mark 1: 2-4, 7); Luke 7:27-28. In all, more than a hundred prophecies recorded in the Old Testament speak about a particular, future Messiah which Jesus, Son of Mary alone, has literally fulfilled the prophetic details. I have barely touched on particular prophetic texts which speak to a future Messiah. Many would say that what I am saying is just a guessing game or mentations of an overactive imagination. There is much more information available to help answer any of a number of religious questions this message has prompted. In the meantime, ponder the implications of this challenge: If an individual is correct that Christianity's claims about the advent and life of Jesus are false, then that individual has nothing to be concerned about regarding his or her personal eternity. On the other hand, if the individual is incorrect in his belief concerning what Jesus claimed about Himself, the unbeliever's eternity with Christ is lost. So, from a Christian perspective, it is infinitely important that individuals accurately "guess" or "predict" whether or not the claims Jesus made concerning his identity, mission, and future of humanity are true. As the Christmas season envelops us, I would encourage people to ponder the prophetic predictions above and particularly what Jesus Himself claimed according to John 14:1-6 and John 3:16.

As a person of faith in Christ, I do not believe that Jesus was confused or just guessing about His identity or the future of humanity. I am convinced that the fingerprint of His identity is inscribed in the prophetic texts, and that the biographies of Jesus (the Gospels) affirm in a convincing way His messianic and other claims as well as many of his promises.

May the advent of the Messiah Jesus, Savior and Lord embrace you and dwell in your soul that you may see Him face to face in his eternal Kingdom. John 20: 24-29.
